Norske Skog Tasman Limited (NZ) was established in July 2000 following the Norske Skog purchase of Fletcher Challenge Paper. The Tasman mill is situated in Kawerau, in the central North Island of New Zealand.

- To visit [Norske Skog Tasman](#), Visitors **must be over the age of 12**
- You must wear enclosed footwear (no jandals, sandals or bare feet)
- You will be issued with a Visitor/Public Tour Pass, Safety Glasses, Ear Plugs, Hard Hat & Hi Viz Vest by the Tour Guide/s responsible for your visit
- Women may prefer to wear trousers as part of the tour encompasses walking up stairs
- Minimum clothing/PPE requirements (must be worn at all times);
  - **HI VIZ CLOTHING**
  - **ENCLOSED FOOTWEAR**
  - **SAFETY EYE WEAR**
  - **HEARING PROTECTION (where required)**
- You will watch a 20 minute video showing the process from Forest to Finished Product
- The Walking Tour takes around 1 – 1½ hours to complete. This is where you watch the Video, start from the Main Gate/Security Building, head towards the Wood Processing area..... and finish up at the Paper Finishing/Warehouse departments
- A Bus/Vehicle Tour includes the Video, a drive around the Site then out to the Ponds/Wetland/Recycling areas. This tour takes around 1 – 1½ hours to complete (*Children under the age of 12 years old are permitted on these tours **only***)
- The Mill Tours can be enjoyed and appreciated by people of all Cultures, Backgrounds and Walks of Life and are absolutely FREE of charge
- Should you be found guilty of misconduct, you will be removed from the Mill Site and refused future access indefinitely!
- Site Safety rules are to be adhered to at **ALL TIMES**
