The prohibited fire ban for the Kawerau District is still in place. This means no open fires or burning of rubbish are permitted. Traditional hangi or umu are permitted as long as people follow strict rules which are outlined on www.checkitsalright.nz

COVID-19 TESTING & ASSESSMENT STATION 10AM-2PM

COVID-19 Testing Station in Kawerau

A COVID-19 testing station will open in Kawerau on Thursday, 9 April. It will be open 10am to 2pm on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturdays.

People who have a cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose are eligible for testing. Symptoms can be with or without a fever.

It is a drive-through station based at the Ron Hardie Recreation Centre carpark. People do not get out of their vehicles for testing.
