From the Mayor

I wish to acknowledge and thank the submitters to our Representation Arrangement Review. Despite the challenges of COVID-19 Alert Level 2, we invited submitters to speak at the Hearing in person. We are now considering these submissions, which were mainly on the subject of introducing Māori Wards or constituencies.

At the monthly Council Meeting, we will consider the subject of Māori Wards and the Representation Review (which is the number of Councillors).

At this same meeting, we navigate the next step of the proposed Three Waters Reform. Our Council will formally adopt and approve our report to the government via Minister Nanaia Mahuta.

We wish to acknowledge the huge response by members of our community to provide feedback. More than 210 people have responded.

It is evident that people have taken the time to become informed and have asked good questions and voiced their feedback about the proposed reform. We will also submit your feedback to the Government on 30 September.

A reminder, this has not been a formal consultation process. We still intend to conduct a formal engagement process to discuss the proposed Three Waters Reform and engage with Mana Whenua, Iwi and hapū, stakeholders and residents.

We are expecting this to be in the last quarter of 2021 and will have a clearer timeline once we submit our report and hear back from the Minister.

We will keep you informed.

## THANKS FOR YOUR THREE WATERS REFORM FEEDBACK

# Thank you for the feedback from the community that has been pouring in over the past few days. More than 210 residents provided feedback.

We appreciate that people wanted to have their voice heard and added to the report that Council has to give back to the Government Department of Internal Affairs.

Council greatly appreciates the time residents and ratepayers are taking to provide feedback, ask questions and seek clarification about the Government's Three Waters Reform proposal.

All feedback will be compiled and added to Council's report to the Government. This feedback and the report will be made public at the Council Meeting on Tuesday, 28 September (the feedback, agenda and report will be on the Council website and available in the Council Offices).

Please note, this is not a formal consultation process. Council still intends to conduct a formal process where we discuss and engage with mana whenua, stakeholders, residents and ratepayers.

Kawerau and all other Councils in New Zealand will submit their reports to Government by end of September. The Minister will then come back with a response and we expect this will give us a clearer understanding of the timeline and when we can carry out our formal consultation process. *Contact Council on 07 306 9009 if you wish to know more and our team can assist you.* 



## **REPRESENTATION REVIEW –** THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUBMISSIONS

Council wishes to acknowledge the submitters for their feedback, and particularly, those who took the time to speak to the Representation Review Hearing in person.

The Mayor and Councillors are still considering the submissions to the Representation Arrangement Review, held at the extraordinary meeting earlier on Tuesday, 14 September.

At the Council Meeting on Tuesday, 28 September – Kawerau District Council will consider both the representation review (i.e., the numbers of Councillors that represent Kawerau) and the subject of Māori wards as raised by the submitters.

There was some discussion about the timeframe to introduce Māori wards at the Hearing with regards to making changes for the 2022 and 2025 elections. The Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) has since confirmed that the timeframe for implementing Māori wards for the 2022 elections was 21 May 2021.

We will provide an update following the meeting on Tuesday 28 September.

## **COUNCIL BRIEFS**

### **RESOURCE MANAGEMENT**

The Resource Management Act (RMA) review is currently underway with Government and is going to be another big change for Councils.

The current RMA is said to be outdated, slow, expensive and not aligning with the principals of the Treaty of Waitangi. The intention is that a new resource management system will deal with challenges more efficiently for current and future generations.

Central government announced in February 2021 that new legislation will be enacted based on recommendations from the Resource Management Review Panel. Their three propositions are a Natural and Build Environments Act (NBA). Strategic Planning Act (SPA) and Climate Adaptation Act (CAA).

The proposal is that Natural and Build Environments Act will replace the current RMA. It will be an integrated statute for land use and environmental protection.

## **DISTRICT PLAN REVIEW**

In our Long Term Plan 2021-2031 we had budgeted to continue with the District Plan Review. This is a major undertaking for Council and is completed every 10 years. However, Council is currently assessing how the Resource Management Act reform affects the review of the District Plan.

## **RATES EXTENSION PERIOD ENDS**

Thanks to all our ratepayers who have now paid their first rates instalment. Council had extended the payment period until Friday, 24 September to enable people who pay in the Council Offices time to pay this.
