TE KŌWHIRINGA PŌTI 2022 - LOCAL ELECTIONS 2022

Every three years elections are held for local government to elect a Mayor and Councillors. Nominations are now open for the Kawerau District Mayor and eight Councillors to represent the district. Nominations are open until 12 noon on 12 August 2022. To have your say on who represents the Kawerau District you need to be enrolled to vote. If you haven't received your voter enrolment pack, please visit vote.nz or phone **0800 ENROLNOW (0800 36 76 56).** Enrolments close on 12 August.





THREE WATERS REFORM UPDATE



Council maintains it stance against the government's Three Waters Reform and has recently submitted to the Water Entity Bill. The submission outlined how Three Waters model of 'mega entities' will severely disadvantage Kawerau residents.

This has been confirmed by independent experts, Council staff and the government's own modelling process. Council estimates that even after receiving the funding pledged by government, Kawerau will lose out on assets valued around \$70 million.

Kawerau District Council agrees that the status quo is not an option and confirms its obligations to provide quality drinking water that meets all requirements and to responsibly manage wastewater and storm water.

As a local government organisation, Council is continuing to work with the Three Waters Reform process, but continues to maintain its stance against the current reform model.

Kawerau joined Communities 4 Local Democracy with 30plus other councils when it was formed in 2021 to ask the government to halt the process and to look at alternative reform models.

VIRTUAL PUBLIC FORUM

If you wish to raise an issue with the elected members, Council is offering a 'virtual public forum' – where residents can videoconference in either from your home or our Council Office (if you do not have online access at home).

The idea is that even at the orange setting, residents can talk directly to the Mayor and Councillors at their fortnightly meetings.

Let us know the Friday prior to a Council Meeting by phone, email or pop into the Council Office.

DOG REGISTRATION RENEWALS WERE DUE ON 31 JULY 2022

Every dog must be registered before it is three (3) months of age, and from then on registration must be renewed each year.

Payment of dog registration was due on **31 July 2022.**Payment after this date will have incurred a 50% penalty from **2 August 2022.**

SPECIAL CONSULTATIVE PROCEDURE - KAWERAU DISTRICT COUNCIL ALCOHOL CONTROL BYLAW 2022

Kawerau District Council has reviewed its liquor bylaw and the newly proposed Alcohol Control Bylaw 2022 is now open for consultation.

Council has done this to help reduce alcohol related crime and disorder by controlling the possession and consumption of alcohol in public places.

The bylaw aims to establish alcohol-free areas, enabling Police and Council to better promote and maintain public health and safety within the central district.

Residents and ratepayers can get involved by sending in a submission and/or by attending one of the informal 'drop in' sessions at the Council Chambers. The drop-in sessions are a chance for attendees to be presented with more information and to talk to Council staff.

COUNCIL DIRECTED TO FLUORIDATE

Kawerau District Council confirms it has received a Manatū Hauora (Ministry of Health) directive to fluoridate the drinking water supply from 31 January 2023.

The directive from Director General of Health Dr Ashley Bloomfield outlined that in accordance with section 116I of the Act, Council is required to ensure that by 31 January 2023 the Kawerau water supply would be fluoridated at the optimal levels (between 0.7ppm to 1ppm, parts per million).

Dr Bloomfield's letter said that fluoridation of the Kawerau drinking water supply is an important step in improving the oral health of our communities.
