### Kawerau District Council establishes Māori wards

Council voted yes to establishing one or more Māori wards for the 2025 and 2028 triennial elections at an extraordinary meeting on Wednesday, 22 November.

With 61.7% of Kawerau's population identifying as Māori (2018 Census), Council invited the views and preferences of Tangata Whenua, Iwi, and the community at the public forum. Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora Trust were among the submitters who presented via zoom along with members of the community who presented in person to the Mayor and councillors at the extraordinary meeting.

The decision followed an engagement process carried out by the Council from late September to November 2023 that included meetings with Tangata Whenua Iwi and the community.

Mayor Faylene Tunui wished to thank the community and submitters for sharing their views and for presenting their feedback to the elected members at the meeting with great respect.

"We are governed by systems that determine these electoral processes, but it is people who look after people, and we have seen that honoured today by the community and our team of elected members. We make the decisions today, to lay the foundations for tomorrow."

To support the process Council engaged Election Services' Electoral Officer Dale Ofsoske to provide independent oversight, information, and guidance on the three elements of the electoral decision process comprising:

- Review of the electoral voting system: Council retained the first past the post (FPP) voting system on Friday 6 September 2023;
- 2. Review of the establishment of Māori ward/s, by 23/11/2023
- 3. Review the representation arrangements by 31/07/2024

Council received some 165 submissions via an online survey and the Council newsletter and thanks everyone for sharing their views in this process.

Based on the current structure of Kawerau District Council with the Mayor and eight councillors, the vote to establish one or more Māori wards may mean:

- four general councillors elected from 1-4 general wards
- four Māori councillors elected from 1-4 Māori wards

However, the 2024 review of the representation arrangements will determine this and requires further informal engagement and two formal submission processes, with a decision to be made in relation to representation arrangements for Kawerau District Council for the 2025 and 2028 elections by 31 July 2024.

## **Changes to Bus Route 135**

The Bay of Plenty Regional Council is introducing some changes to the Kawerau Route 135 bus route and timetable to enhance access within and around Kawerau.

The change started on Monday 27 November 2023 and means when the bus returns to Kawerau from Whakatāne, it will take a new route so that passengers on the town centre loop are more often able to alight closer to their initial boarding points.

#### Please note;

- The bus will no longer service the bus stop outside Tarawera High School on River Road, this stop has been decommissioned,
- The Route 135a service at 12.45 pm is replaced by the new Route 135

These modifications have impacted on some bus timings so please refer to the bus schedule online or at the Kawerau isite which shows the new schedule and map.

Fares remain the same price. If you are a Community Services Card holder, you may be eligible for a 50% discount on fares with the Community Connect Concession. This concession needs to be loaded onto your Bee Card. You can purchase a Bee Card from the Kawerau isite.

#### Parks & Reserves Team Update

The Parks and Reserves team have a significant impact on Kawerau. Planting flower-bedding displays, they are making the town look and feel beautiful. This summer is no different. The team are planting a wide range of flowers, including marigolds, wildflowers, dahlias, and salvias, which attract butterflies.

The Kawerau Fire Station comprises of both Career and Volunteer staff who work together to provide a 24/7 service to the community. In addition to emergency response, the brigade provides a number of other functions free of charge to the community, including;

- Home Fire Safety Visits and Advice
- Firewise materials for Schools and Kohanga Reo
- Assistance siting and installing smoke alarms
- Advice to Community Groups
- Support to Community Events

# Wildfire Prevention courtesy of the Kawerau Fire and Emergency Services

As we head into summer, the current national weather modelling confirms we will experience El Niño climatic conditions across the region. As these conditions intensify over the next few months we can expect above average temperatures, below average rainfall, and slightly stronger winds through the season. This weather system will no doubt increase our wildfire risk and as a community largely surrounded by forest, it is important that we are aware of safe practices when it comes to managing sparks and heat generating activities.

In New Zealand, 98% of wildfires are started by people. Your actions will make all the difference.

- Can I light a fire? Before you light any fire, go to checkitsalright.nz to check the conditions to make sure it is all right to light. If we are in a restricted fire season you may need to apply for a permit.
- \* Note there is a Regional Bylaw which prevents open air burn piles at properties within 100m of a neighboring dwelling house.
