Tume Whakarae | Chief Executive's Message

Tēnā tatou katoa – warm greetings to you all in our community of Kawerau and welcome to the August issue of the Council's Community Update. The ongoing issues of high groundwater levels has continued to be challenging for residents in the Hardie Avenue area. The passive drainage systems have been completed and we are heartened some residents have seen a reduction in water levels on their properties. The external drainage engineers who are working with us on this project are advising the best plans to reinstate drainage on Hilldale Reserve and also on the farmland behind homes.

We are also pleased to complete the drainage for a section of River Road by the Transfer Station Road experiencing similar issues with groundwater levels. The next step is to repair this section of road and footpath areas.

Last year, Council was directed by Manatū Hauora (Ministry of Health) to fluoridate the drinking water supply to improve oral health. The issues with discoloured water have delayed this project. Council has now awarded the tender and plans to have the work completed later this year. Congratulations also to two of our longestserving employees Erika Valk and Susan Harris, both from the District Library team who are celebrating 35 and 30 years of service respectively. Thank you for your commitment and loyalty to our community.

Looking ahead, Council is starting the groundwork on the 10-year plan that Council must complete every three years. This Long Term Plan 2024-2034 outlines Council's activities, services and projects for the district; and how these will be funded: from rates, user pays and other funding sources.

Next week, a survey will be delivered to all residents (also available online). What will Kawerau be like in 10 years? What will Council do to bring about that change? We look forward to your feedback to help us plan and prioritise what you want for Kawerau.

Fluoridation



Kawerau District Council had been directed by Manatū Hauora (Ministry of Health) to fluoridate the drinking water supply by 30 June 2023. Work was delayed due to the

unexpected levels of manganese causing discoloured drinking water from early January to May 2023. Since then, the tender has been awarded to Trility – an Australianbased company specialising in engineering and water services. Trility has completed several similar projects in New Zealand and internationally.

Funded by the Manatū Hauora, this project should be completed by the end of 2023. In conjunction with the fluoridation project, Council will also be completing major water pump replacements. The current pumps which were originally donated by the (former) Tasman Pulp and Paper Mill, are around sixty years old. The upgrade will make waterflow more efficient and economical.

Three Waters Reform Update

The re-set in April of the Government's Three Waters' Reform has Kawerau as part of the Bay of Plenty Water Service Entity. This means Kawerau water assets would be managed by an entity covering Kawerau, Rotorua, Whakatāne, Ōpōtiki, Tauranga and Western Bay. Discussions are underway between these councils about when the entity would be stood up and also what the entity would look like.

Long Term Plan 2024-2034

Council is starting work on the plan for the next 10 years – which we call the Long Term Plan 2024-2034. This will set the direction for all activities and services we provide; and outlines how Council will pay for them.

It's still early days in the planning process - but we want to hear what's important to you, our community. Look out for links to an online survey to give feedback about the direction and priorities you want Council to deliver for our community.

River Road Drainage Works



The drainage work at River Road beside Transfer Station Road has been completed. This flooding was due to high groundwater levels after the high summer rainfall levels. The passive drainage systems installed will assist with moving the water from these areas. The next stage of this project is repairing the section of road, footpath, kerb and channelling that was badly damaged due to the flooding.

Council wishes to thank residents for their patience while this work has been completed. The next stage of rebuilding the road will impact traffic movements and we apologise in advance for the inconvenience.

Civil Defence Group Plan Review – Open for Submissions

The Group Plan is a strategic document about how the Bay of Plenty Civil Defence Emergency Management (CDEM) Group works with the community before, during and after emergencies. The emergency management plan is for all the councils in the Bay of Plenty region, the joint committee is chaired by Mayor Faylene Tunui. Specialists in science, land management and planning were available to answer questions and hear feedback on the draft policy options to improve waterways in the Tarawera group of catchments or Freshwater Management Unit.

Dog Registrations

Thank you to all residents who have registered and paid for their favourite furry friends.

How's the wai | water at your place?

Our Three Water's testing shows that the issue of higher manganese levels causing the drinking water to discolour earlier this year has been removed due to changing the water source.

We are currently only using water from the Tarawera Bores, after testing showed that the Te Wai o Marukaa Spring (PumpHouse Spring) had increased levels of manganese which were responsible for the browning of the water once it combined with the chlorine used to treat the water quality.

With the ongoing replacement of drinking water pipes in town (now in Fenton Street area) - there may be some temporary discolouration once the new water pipes are connected, but that should only be short-term.
