Rangi Delamere Pavilion Rebuild

Work is progressing with the rebuild of the Rangi Delamere Pavilion.

Contractors have now taken down the all-weather cover and rigging, and work is turning to the inside and lining work.

Council is liaising with the whānau of the namesake, Rangi Delamere, a renowned tennis and netball stalwart of the community with regards to the signage to recognise their kuia.

The aim is that the building becomes a multi-purpose facility for the community.

Whānau and Council are also working together regarding the official opening. At this stage it looks like the official opening of the pavilion may occur in early 2024, but we will keep you posted.

Parks and Gardens update

Our team will be preparing the garden beds for summer planting next month, including removing our beautiful tulip bulbs.

Our main supplier, Van Eden Tulips is closing and has advised us of a shortage in bulbs for next year, which will create a significant price increase with any other suppliers. So instead, we are going to try harvesting, drying, and storing this year's bulbs so we will have some for planting next Spring. This will mean a significant saving but will also mean that there will be no free tulip bulbs for the community this year. Thanks for your understanding.

Updated tsunami evacuation zones

Civil Defence Bay of Plenty has recently updated the region's tsunami evacuation zone maps.

While Kawerau is not classified as having a tsunami risk in the event of an earthquake – we're far enough inland for it not to be a problem for us – you may have whānau who work , play or attend schools closer to the coast. In this case, it would be a good idea to make yourselves familiar with the updated maps.

Council's Customer Services team can take the details or even better log the job via the Antenno app with a photograph and this gives a GPS co-ordinate for Horizon Energy.

Māori wards for Kawerau District Council?

Council is keen to hear your thoughts on whether Kawerau District Council should establish Māori wards in addition to the current general ward in future council elections. After choosing to retain the first past the post voting system on 6 September, Council also unanimously resolved to consider whether to introduce one or more Māori wards for the Kawerau District Council for the 2025 and 2028 triennial election; and that Iwi and public consultation takes place regarding this during September and October 2023.

To help inform their decision-making, Council has recently been engaging with Tangata Whenua and the community, including public meetings at Rautahi Marae, Concert Chamber and Tarawera High School on 22 and 25 September and 9 October.

There's still time to have your say on this important issue. Council is keen to hear your thoughts on whether Kawerau District Council should establish Māori wards in addition to the current general ward in future council elections.
