

## PROPOSED BOUNDARY CHANGES BETWEEN KAWERAU AND WHAKATĀNE DISTRICT

After requests and consultation with Iwi and hapu, Kawerau District Council is proposing changes to the boundary with neighbouring Whakatāne District.

The proposed changes would see three areas totaling 550 hectares being transferred to the Kawerau District. The areas are:

- 1. Land identified for expansion of the Pūtauaki Industrial Park.
- 2. Land housing Tohia o Te Rangi Marae at 137 Spencer Avenue which is currently accessed and serviced by the Kawerau District.
- 3. The part of the Otarahanga Farm currently in the Whakatāne District. The farm is accessed from Kawerau District and is currently dissected by the boundary between Kawerau and Whakatane Districts.

The Local Government Commission is currently seeking feedback about this proposal. The Commission acknowledges the interests of Ngāti Tūwharetoa (Bay of Plenty), Ngāti Awa and Ngāti Rangitihi iwi and hapū and will engage specifically with iwi and hapū.

Council is currently awaiting feedback after applying for \$4.3 million of 'Better Off Funding' to progress the Stoneham Park residential development at the former soccer club grounds.

As planned, the next step will be to continue engaging with neighbours, lwi and Tangata Whenua and stakeholders about the development.

The opportunity to apply for the funding is via the Government's Three Waters Reform and is part of the total \$17.2m offered to the Kawerau rohe | district.

After several workshops, and the completion of an initial feasibility report, the Council resolved on September 27 to apply for the funding and use it to fund stage one of the Stoneham Park residential development. The feasibility

report shows that Council is best placed as the developer with the aim of providing a variety of housing options for families, seniors and inter-generational living.

The funding will be 'recycled' through the stages of the development and be available at the completion for use in other community projects and/or infrastructure.

Council is currently working to progress the change of status for Stoneham Park from reserve to residential and is proposing a Residential Development Precinct to maximise the development. We will keep you updated as to the timing for consultation and engagement and look forward to your continued support to provide more housing for our rohe.
