AGE FRIENDLY AND DISABILITY STRATEGY

Thank you to Kawerau and Districts Ageing in Place (KADAP) for running the Seniors Survey. In total there were 310 responses. The feedback received from the survey will help Kadap and Council, and other seniors' focused groups improve their services.

The Council is about to review its Age Friendly and Disability Policy and will be seeking feedback from a number of community groups and organisations. We will also give members of the public an opportunity to have input. Please keep an eye on the website and Facebook pages for more information.

ALCOHOL CONTROL BYLAW 2022

If you are planning a wedding at the picturesque Stoneham Walk or a function at one of Kawerau's venues, it is important to know that a new Alcohol Control Bylaw 2022 was adopted in September.



The purpose of the bylaw is to control the consumption of alcohol in public places to reduce alcohol related harm. Updating the bylaw makes it easier for the Police to enforce the regulations.

The areas covered by the alcohol-free zone have been clarified and include the central business district, Prideaux Park, Stoneham Walk and the Kawerau Cemetery.

Council venues are also included in the alcohol-free zones, including the District Offices, Town Hall, Concert Chambers, Ron Hardie Rec Centre and the Maurie Kjar Memorial Aquatic Centre.

A major change is that the Maurie Kjar Memorial Aquatic Centre is now part of the bylaw area making it an alcoholfree zone. The aquatic centre is a popular venue for private hires for children's birthday parties, sports team functions and family gatherings. Council believes excluding the consumption of alcohol at the venue is in line with the best practice health and safety guidelines.

If you are wanting to have alcohol at a Council venue a dispensation or special license must be sought.

Special Licenses must be applied for 20 working days in advance.

Dispensations need to be lodged 14 working days prior in advance.

The bylaw came into effect on 23 September 2022.

- Creation of a community film or a public artwork by/for the community
- Seminars for local artist development
- Creative performances, workshops or wananga for young people

KAWERAU DISTRICT COUNCIL WINS FAIR GO MOST AFFORDABLE SERVICES

Fair Go has recently completed a 'Council Charges Challenge' that investigated all New Zealand Councils and their fees. Kawerau District Council came out on top with the most affordable service fees for its residents.

Fair Go stated that Kawerau "is the cheapest place to register a dog (\$37 per year), the lowest fixed charge for water (\$82 per year) and also charges the least for a Land Information Memorandum (\$168), the report that helps you check out a property".
