## COUNCIL SCRAPS OVERDUE LIBRARY BOOK FEES



### Council says no more overdue library fees!

Kawerau is among the majority of Councils nationwide that have made the decision to go fine-free for overdue library books. The idea behind Fine Free Aotearoa is that everyone

can have fair and easy access to information, reading, and learning through our libraries.

Some families have stopped going to the library altogether due to the fear of running up even small fines which they cannot afford

Kawerau District Library aims to give access to everyone, and this new policy, hopes to achieve that.

Council approved the new fines free policy as part of the 2022/2023 Annual Plan process and this new policy came effect on 1 July 2022.

In addition, any overdue fines on library cards as at 30 June 2022 will be wiped, though outstanding debts that relate to missing books will remain on cards and continue to apply.

Customers with library cards that were previously blocked due to unpaid overdue fines will now be able to use their cards by talking to library staff to remove their old debts.

Thank you for your submissions and interest for the Kawerau District Council Proposed Alcohol Control Bylaw 2022.

Council appreciates your time, feedback and involvement in this process. Submissions closed on 19 August 2022, and Council has received four total submissions from residents, ratepayers, businesses and community organisations.

The Council had scheduled a hearing for these submitters on 30 August, but as no submitters wished to speak, the Council will consider these submissions as part of the new bylaw and communicate directly with submitters.

### Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) Collection

RAT collections in Kawerau will now be facilitated by Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora located at 28-30 Islington Street Kawerau. The process of ordering your RAT's remains the same:

- You can order the test kits online from requestrats. covid19.health.nz or by ringing 0800 222 478 (option 3) from 8am to 8pm. You will need to have access to a mobile phone to validate their order.
- You will be issued an order number. You can then collect your RAT order from Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora in Kawerau (or an alternative collection site listed on healthpoint.co.nz).
- For people who are not unwell or a household contact but want to get a RAT for other purposes, such as visiting an elderly relative, there are retail options available.
- You can request RAT's on behalf of someone else.
