Driver Operator Training Centre opens

This month the Eastern Bay of Plenty's new driver and operator training centre in Manukorihi Drive in Kawerau was named, blessed and officially opened.

Toi EDA Chair, David Turner, had the honour of cutting the ribbon, and Reverend Graham Te Rire (pictured) shared the name gifted to the new facility, Te Ara Huringa ô Pupuwharau.

Deputy Mayor Faylene Tunui represented the Kawerau District at the opening.

The centre is the culmination of work by local industry and Toi EDA to address workforce availability and transportation constraints in the Eastern Bay. The Kawerau facility will serve the wider Eastern Bay

to upskill people as drivers, machine operators and logistics personnel.

It became a reality due to support from the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment, through both Te Ara Mahi and He Poutama Rangatahi funds.

David thanked those involved for "an incredible collaborative effort from the Toi EDA team, our training providers and Kawerau's Pathway to Work partners."

Toi EDA has partnered with three training providers, Toi Ohomai, Axiom Training and Vertical Horizonz.

Programmes started on 19 August and include training for drivers, machine operators, confined space, and a range of mobile equipment operators required in construction, agricultural and horticultural contracting work.

Research recently conducted by the Bay of Connections Freight and Logistics Group indicate an additional 300-400 more drivers and mobile plant operators will be needed in the next two to five years.

This facility is a way to help address that gap. Through the training, new cadetships, and mentoring programmes, Te Ara Huringao ô Pupuwharau will create new opportunities for Eastern Bay people.

COUNCIL PROJECTS

Removal of Liquid Amber trees

Contractors have finished the work removing 47 Liquid Amber trees from the Valley Road roundabout up to the Cemetery.

Council agreed to remove these exotic trees as they are creating a number of problems and safety issues including:

- Threatening the water supply integrity as they were planted close to the water main pipe and the roots are now dangerously close;
- Damage to the footpath which is creating costly repairs and also trip hazards (pictured);

- Trip hazards with the tree root system and seed pods above the ground;
- Brittle branches in the Spring which are also dangerous;
- Threatening homes as they are now so large.


This wood was offered to Valley Road residents in the vicinity of the felling, for firewood.

Council is now working on a plan to replant these areas with more suitable trees.

There have been suggestions by some Valley Road residents to plant a mixture of natives and fruit trees.







Cemetery expansion work

The levelling and shaping work has been completed at the Kawerau Cemetery in the first step of the expansion project.

Council is now working to renew the front fence and front garden and sections of the footpath (pictured) at the Kawerau Cemetery entrance.

COUNCIL PROJECTS

Water Tap (chlorine free) Improvements

Following last month's Council meeting, there have been improvements made to the Town Centre water tap (pictured) where chlorine-free water is available and also the River Road Pumphouse chlorine-free water outlet.

Both water taps have had a raised platform added below one tap, where people can rest their large containers, as they are being filled. The other side on both taps remains the same, so users can place large containers on the concrete surface while they are filling them.

There has been a larger concrete pad added to the Town Centre water tap, as this area was becoming muddy and wet from the water overflowing.



River Road - Tamarangi Drive Garden

Council staff will be working to develop this garden area further with planting of trees, shrubs and box hedging.

The boxed garden will also be planted with "Kawerau 2019" planting as a point of interest for that entrance into Kawerau.

Re-planting the Mill Corner

Large trees were removed some time ago when the power lines were put underground.

The replanting of this area will begin soon with several hundred plants including five different species of trees and grasses which have been purchased.

Transfer Station

A reminder that the fees for the Transfer Station have increased to recover the increased operation costs.


