I wish to present the following proposal to the Kawerau District Council this morning, on behalf of the *Café Conversations in Kawerau* group. Our aim is to create a holistic environment for the people of Kawerau through improving the visual appearance of our town, and one particular area that we've discussed more at length is our proposed **Demolition Materials and Community Reuse Centre**.

There has recently been an increase in the development of peoples' awareness for the need to do something about the waste that we've been creating and accumulating. Our goal is to suggest that we as a town help. We need to do so for the sake of our environment (we're seeing dramatic and proactive protests throughout NZ and other countries to urge protection of our environment.) We know that suitable landfill areas are dwindling (and countries like China and Cambodia are now unwilling to take our junk for onward disposal.) Our earth's resources are diminishing so rapidly and it's costing us more and more to get rid of these under-utilized resources!

We heard in 2018 of a Waste Audit Survey that had been carried out at our Kawerau Transfer Station by Whakatane's CREW, to see whether it would be viable for them to expand to Kawerau. Sadly they could not justify this venture for themselves, BUT stressed that it would **certainly be viable (and almost necessary) for Kawerau to set up such an enterprise for themselves!**

This Kawerau operation could be based on a 'Bring and Buy' ethic with inward goods and shop being based at the Kawerau Transfer Station (where I understand one used to operate years ago). A good base place could be where the existing 3-4 bay shed is, and the workshop area(s) could be elsewhere. We have canvassed other local groups who we thought may be interested in being involved/helping/supporting whatever, and had generally very positive responses: for instance the MenZshed, Blokes' Shed, KKB, Corrections, Waterwheel Trust, Pou Whakaaro and KADAP to name some, plus other individuals who may not be part of an organized group e.g. unemployed people through WINZ, or volunteers who help in the Op Shops or others yet who may wish to be involved too. Jobs could be passing on or learning old and worthy skills, with many positive social outcomes; there could be reworked / renovated / repurposed appliances sold on, or upcycled / repurposed furniture sold at a 'good price' to those who need it; money could still be gained from selling on scrap metal as is done now, or wooden doors etc for renovations e.g. in a certain style if wanted. The trading centre could certainly be revamped from what is already in place!

Now, to get it to work: we need your 'buy in' please, Kawerau District Council. You will have to make it too expensive for those dumping big items, that could be recycled! Here is where the D.M.C.R.C. Manager will pounce! S/he will be the vital person with the passion for this conceptual enterprise, who will have the keen eye, 'cheek' to ask, and vision of an UPCYCLER, to see the potential of the bulky items in vehicles or on trailers, which take up so much of landfill space... Whereas items such as kitchen crockery, toys, clothing, games, puzzles, curtains etc that are being dealt with already in town, will be siphoned off to those businesses concerned, if they want them. The big items like furniture and/or appliances that are not dealt with by these local business (e.g. no storage), or raw materials etc could be sold off from this newly-established hub, which may even involve council staff!

The District Council could charge car and trailer loads by WEIGHT which would help to encourage townspeople to look sideways— towards the designated bin with this invitation displayed: **TOO GOOD TO DUMP, LEAVE IT IN HERE!** Council staff could also be using their eagle eye for the good stuff to feed into the centre.

Kawerau could again be innovative and help itself by not dumping too much that's unnecessary. We could help each other in a much more constructive way than by just paying 'lip service' to our sense of a healthier environment. The Transfer Station could have a really good buzz about it and the old-fashioned observance of neighbourliness would be to the fore. It could be a service that we're all so proud of that we'll wonder why we let it slip by before.

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2019/2020 Kawerau District Council Submissions

The Kawerau Amateur Swimming Club (KASC) wish to submit the following proposal for consideration by the Kawerau District Council (KDC) in regards to the KASC clubrooms.

Proposal: KASC Clubrooms and Storage Facility.

12th of January 2015 was the day the Kawerau Amateur Swimming Club said goodbye to its beloved clubrooms. As part of a big plan which the KDC was to build new changing rooms where the KASC clubrooms where. We were then meant to move into the old changing rooms building and were told on many occasions that the council was going to refurbish them so we were able to run our swimming club out of them. Correspondence and communication about the removal of our building has taken place right back in September 2012 and.

With many meetings backwards and forwards we are still in the same position as we were back then 4 years ago in the small storage room by the BBQ area which was only meant to be for six months. Four plus years later and we are still in the same room, a room that we have been told not to be in it for long periods of time due to the high sulphur content. A room where water runs into from the lifeguards room next to it when they are showering. A room where our gear is slowly deteriorating over time due to the sulphur. A room which is not big enough for us to run to our full potential.

We feel that this process should not have taken this long. We have been proactive, when asked to produce plans of how we the KASC would like the building to look like. We approached Matthew Reihana-Asquith one of our swimmers who had a keen passion for designing and architecture. He then took it upon himself to make this a project for the Trident High School Science Fair. He went through the process of getting committee members putting their ideas forward and interviewed members as well. He came up with the final plan presented to Tom McDowall and plans were sent to Bernie Tientjes. From there we waited to hear from KDC, they responded with floor plans from DD2 consultants. The committee looked at the plans made some recommendation, was told from KDC we were all ready to go just needed to advertise for contractors.



We have waited and waited with the same push back, and the response of, where getting around to it, christmas is coming, the High School has taken all the contractors, the list goes on.

We feel as a club we have not been given a fair chance and have been forgotten about and pushed aside for far to long. We have followed instructions of what to do from KDC and listened to what they have had to say. Now hearing that the 50m pool maybe on the agenda again we can see maybe why we have been put to one side. At a recent meeting with Hanno he mentioned that they proposed the KASC moving into a shed beside the new changing rooms. To hear that, was something that didn't sit well with our swimming whanau. As some of our whanau have been apart of the KASC for over 20 years, and feel like a shed is not we were promised and why we got rid of our community whare. We just want to have clarification and want to know whats next and why has nothing been confirmed on the new clubrooms, why has it taken so long and an apology for this whole process.

We started this journey back in Sep 2012, when it was talk, about a new pool and new changing rooms. Three years later (Jan 2015) KASC removed their Club Rooms making way for KDC to build new changing rooms and when completed to start refurbishing the old changing rooms for a revamped Club rooms.

In this time frame we have had various meetings, talks and discussions with council staff, DD2 Consultants and Councillors. Plans were approved and we were told that all that was left was to advertise for a contractor to complete the revamp. (22nd Aug 2018) That was many Months ago and several more promises of when it will start.

CLUB ROOMS: A room to have meetings
 A place to do activities
 A room to socialise
 A place to train
 A place to feel safe, warm, and secure

It has been 4 Years and 4 Months since we removed our club rooms. On Jan 18th 2019 I and 2 other committee members spoke to New KDC Management after hearing rumours that KASC would NOT be getting their clubrooms. I was informed that our ideas, plans, constructed criticism, backwards and forwards communication and our final approval was denied due to new management not having enough information. My previous predecessor's and current committee, I'd like to acknowledge and give personal thank. You made this position within the club look easy, your wisdom, guidance and passion have fortified me in managing and navigating this club in working towards a win/win outcome with KDC. At present things are looking a bit blurred.

The Club rooms was not built by the KBC (Kawerau Borough Council). A small Loan was obtained and the community came together and built the KASC clubrooms for the Kawerau community. Many of those families still live in this town and I was humbled by their stories when recalling events, sleep overs, telethons and night and morning trainings at our farewell lunch. The club rooms was and will always be in my eyes a grand old lady, nothing much to look at but strong, safe, warm and secure. My own children had the privilege of her, either waiting to start lessens, homework at the purple table, going upstairs to play table tennis or waiting for me to finish work. It is something that until you do not have it, you don't know you'll miss it.

In identifying and maintaining good working relations with our stakeholders we need to encourage them to invest their time and skills into our club for its future sustainability. We will continue to support all our stakeholders. Kawerau District Council, Whakatane Swim Club, Swim BOP, Swim NZ, Sport BOP Whakatane Beacon, Whakatane Printers, EB Life, Radio 1 XX to name a few. Our club has continued to support annual community events at the Maurie Kjar swimming Pools complex with club members providing either direct assistance and or club resources i.e. lane ropes, starting blocks, flags, and timing devices. Local events have been supported by our club have included Te Whata Tau O Putauaki School, Ngati Tuwharetoa Settlement Trust (BOP), South School, Tarawera High School, Putauaki School, Kawerau Scouts, and Kawerau Interschool Swimming Sports.

I have no doubt that you will work with KASC in getting back its "Robust working relationship" that has been evidential in the past. And Starting with an apology to KASC members, their family's and the community, is a positive foot in the right direction.

In summary I would like to thank the KDC for giving us the opportunity to express ourselves in the 2019/20 Annual Plan Submission form.

Kia Ora, Ko Justin Ross toku ingoa.

I have been apart of the Kawerau Amateur Swimming Club (KASC) for 15 plus years, as a swimmer but also have had the amazing opportunity as being the KASC secretary for the past 6 years. I have seen the KASC grow from a club who only having 3 swimmers going away to swim meets during the summer to now having on average 15 swimmers going away to meets. This growth is something that we as a club and committee have worked really hard on.

During my time on the KASC committee I have been apart of many meetings, discussions email conversation the list goes on with the Kawerau District Council (KDC) in regards to blocks, flags, lane hireage, clashes with other organisations, winter training and the big one our clubrooms.

On the 12th January 2015 we said goodbye to our clubrooms, our tonga, the place which we called home. Knowing full well that in six months time we would have a new home, in the location of the old changing rooms. So we moved all our gear to a small, dark, cold and dingy room by the BBQ area, just remembering its only for six months. We can do six months we told ourselves, that's only one LTS and the rest of our current season. But in fact it didn't take 6 months did it, we are still in that small room as I am writing this letter of support. The thing that annoys me is how can we have managers promise that we will be in our new rooms in six months to then be told after setback after setback that they won't be starting our clubrooms until a later date. It has been an ongoing battle and fight that I have been apart of for the past 5 years. If we had known it was going to take this long to be in the same boat as we are in, I know full well, we as a swimming whanau would have said no to removing our home.

There has been confirmation from both parties about the layout and design for the new clubrooms. That is where it has stopped, then to find out that the new manager of Operations and Services had know idea there was anything discussed or put down on paper about the new clubrooms for the KASC was shocking. It showed me that people that have been apart of this process at KDC level have not passed on any correspondence to him and we were back at square one. When he asked us to put some plans and "needs" into him as he had no idea what we were on about was mind blowing. When the KASC swimming whanau heard about this news, they were not happy, as we felt after getting confirmation sent to us we thought we were on the right path to finally moving into our new home.

That building means so much to us as a club. It is a place where I as a young swimmer would hang out. I would go up the top and do my homework before my lesson, or be waiting patiently at night time while my mum had her swimming hui. A place that I called my second home. The storage space was something we can only dream of at the moment, with what we have which is next to pathetic. Its unsafe, small, damp and just does not fit the purpose of our club. We as a club want to grow even bigger, but we can't. As many people in the community are surprised to hear that there is still a KASC because they thought it folded when the building got removed. They tell us if they had known it was still up and running they would have put there children in our swimming classes.

At the moment the KASC has:

41 Afternoon Swimmers

15 of them are Club Swimmers (attend Meets)

63 swimmers attended our 2018 November LTS

46 swimmers attended our 2019 February LTS

We are finding at times that the current clubrooms are far too small to fit everything in and try and run a successful swimming club as we are growing fast every season.

Please consider our application that we as a swimming whanau are putting forward. As we believe we have been forgotten about and pushed to the side time and time again. I would like us to work alongside each other to come to an agreement that both parties are happy with.

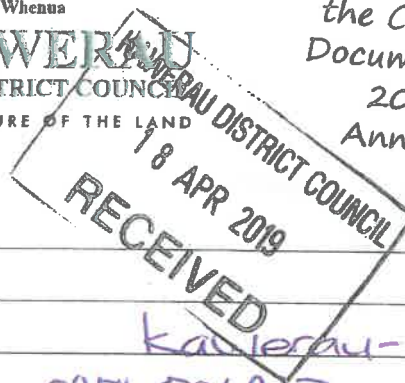

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Submission to Kawerau District Council's 2019-2020 Annual Plan

In this submission, we urge Council to also ensure participation in and support of the Bay of Plenty water safety strategy to reduce the excessive numbers of preventable drowning, particularly amongst Maori and migrants.

Introduction

1. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Kawerau District Council (KDC) 2019-2020 Annual Plan consultation document. We note and support KDC's commitment to swimming pool safety standards and ensuring that all swimming pools in the region comply with statutory requirements.
2. Water Safety New Zealand (WSNZ) would like to inform KDC on the background to, and priority work streams of, the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy. We believe KDC should recognise preventable drowning in the Eastern Bay of Plenty as a critical community issue which requires a collective response to reduce.
3. The over-arching purpose for this submission is to bring awareness to the recently developed Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy and the potential impacts this strategy can have on the Eastern Bay of Plenty by reducing the disproportionate numbers of preventable drownings that are occurring.
4. More specifically, WSNZ would also like KDC to support the implementation of the Bay of Plenty water safety strategy by:
 - contributing to funding the salary and operational costs of the Sport Bay of Plenty (Sport BoP) Water Safety Strategy Manager for the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy;
 - working in partnership with WSNZ in the development of signage and in developing better collaborative relationships with Māori;
 - engaging with the coalition of interested parties already present within the Eastern Bay of Plenty community on the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy; and
 - including the Bay of Plenty Regional Water Safety Strategy in its community communications.

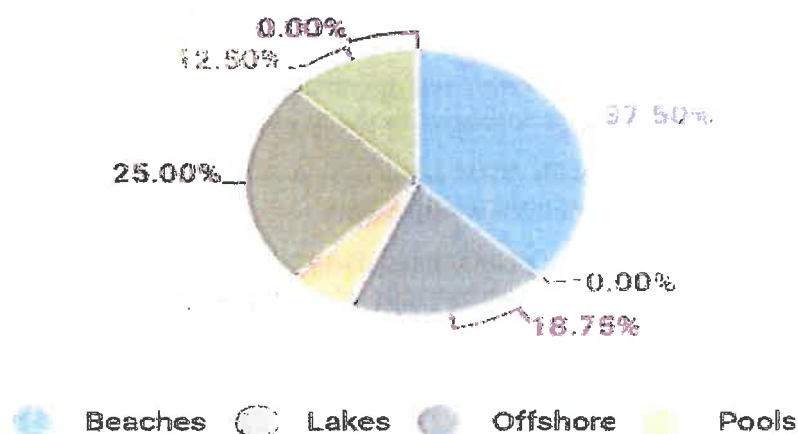
Preventable Drowning in the Eastern Bay of Plenty

5. Sadly, the Bay of Plenty region is overrepresented in New Zealand's drowning statistics and although there was a decrease in preventable drownings in 2018 nationwide, the Bay of

Plenty region saw an increase in preventable drownings. Drownings in the Eastern Bay of Plenty made up a significant proportion of these drownings with a rate of 3.1 preventable drowning fatalities per 100,000 of population.

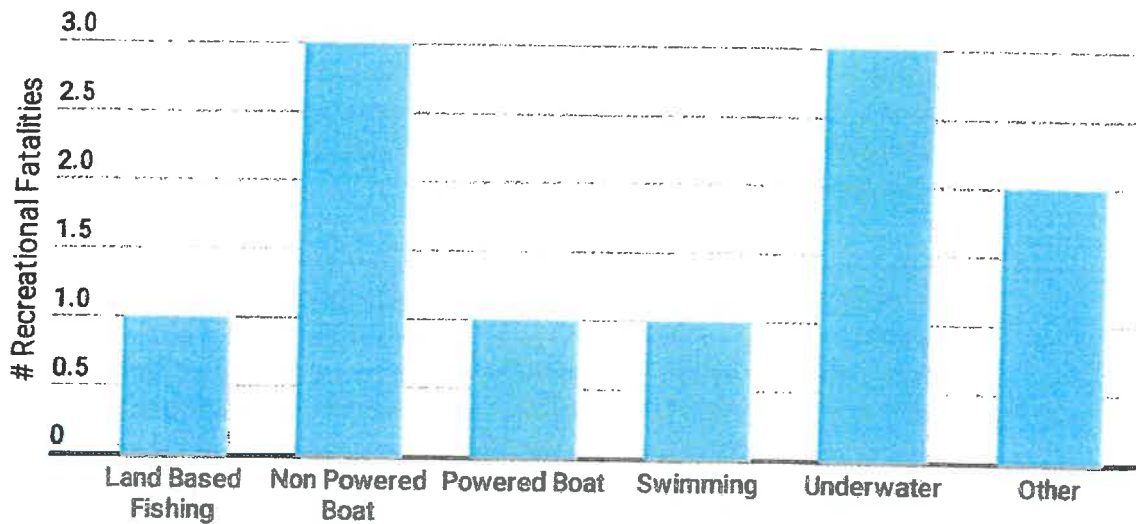
6. WSNZ has undertaken analysis of preventable drowning data from 2009-2018 for three separate subregions in the Bay of Plenty: Eastern Bay of Plenty, Rotorua Lakes and Western Bay of Plenty. Key points from this analysis are:
 - Over the past ten years there were 79 drowning fatalities in the Bay of Plenty, 16 of these (20% of the total) were in the Eastern Bay of Plenty.
 - The Bay of Plenty region's 2018 preventable drowning toll was 13 - the highest equal number of drowning deaths in any region, alongside Auckland. This was Bay of Plenty's highest total since 1990.
 - Bay of Plenty's drowning rate per 100,000 of population was over twice the national rate in 2018.
 - 44% of Asian and 27% of Māori preventable drowning deaths in New Zealand over the past ten years occurred in the Bay of Plenty, the highest regional totals for these ethnicities.
 - There were 5 home pool deaths in the Bay of Plenty in 2019, the highest number since records began, which made up 62.5% of all home pool deaths nationwide.
7. Further examination of the 2009-2018 data on preventable drowning deaths revealed for the Eastern Bay of Plenty
 - the vast majority of preventable drowning deaths occurred either at beaches (37.5% of total) rivers (25%) or offshore (18.75%);

Percentage of Preventable Drownings in the Eastern Bay of Plenty 2009-18 by environment



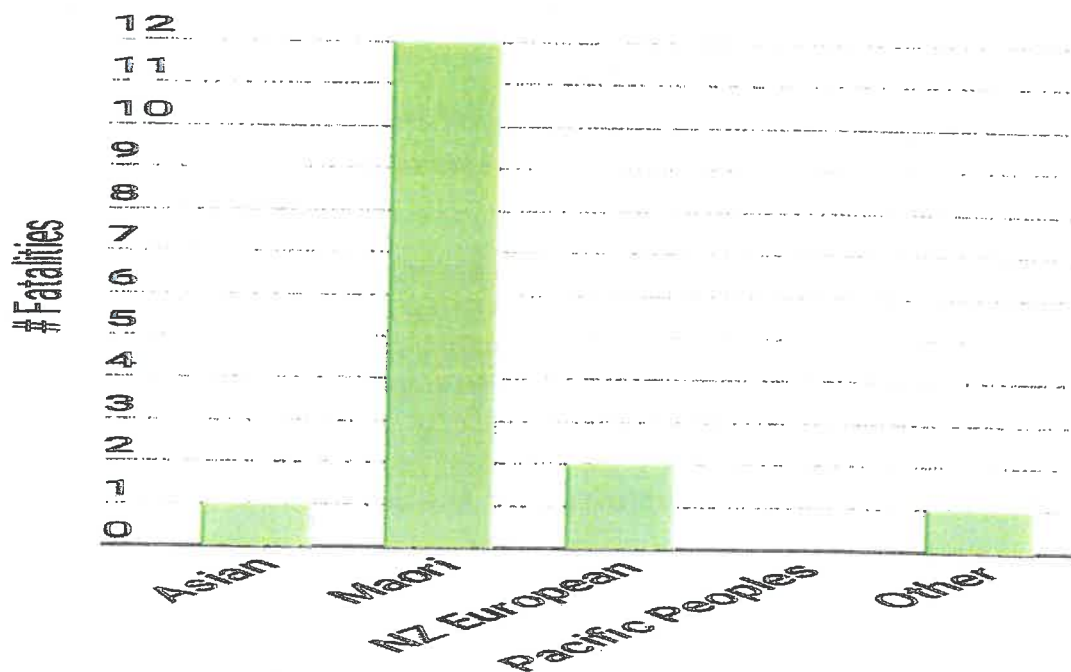
- Non-powered boating and underwater were the most common activities leading to drowning

Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy

8. WSNZ is the recognised leadership organisation for the water safety sector and it has the central policy and advocacy role for the sector. As part of this policy role, over the past 18 months WSNZ has been developing a series of pilot water safety strategies in regions with high preventable drowning rates, including the Bay of Plenty. These strategies have been developed in consultation with sector stakeholders and the community and they focus on reducing drowning deaths and injuries and building a culture of safe enjoyment around water in a region. The objective of this work has been to develop a coordinated and collaborative action plan for water safety in each region that identifies priority work streams and investments for drowning prevention.
9. A Project Leadership Group of representatives from regional organisations with interest in water safety was established to act as the owners of the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy development process. In addition to supporting the development and monitoring the strategy's implementation, the Leadership Group also agreed vision and mission for the strategy to provide high-level objectives for the region's water safety activity. The Project Leadership Group has been chaired by Shirley Baker, a member of the Sport BoP Board.
10. The Bay of Plenty water safety strategy has recently been completed and it identifies a number of priority actions, a copy of the strategy is attached for your reference. These are:
 - Full rollout of the Water Skills for Life (WSFL) programme to all primary school children.
 - All recreational watercraft users qualified and/or become members of Coastguard.
 - Sustained investment in both current and new activities aimed at preventing attitudes and behaviours that lead to drowning.
 - All stakeholders involved in water-based activity participate in regular hui/forums.
 - Males targeted with water safety messages that reduce risk taking behaviour.
 - Development of internationally recognised signage.
 - A sustained collaborative relationship with Iwi and other relevant Maori stakeholders.
11. Implementing the strategy will be led by Sport Bay of Plenty and they are to recruit a Strategy Manager to coordinate, facilitate and review the delivery of programmes and initiatives for the Strategy's priority actions. Suitable interventions for, and providers to deliver, the priority actions across the Bay of Plenty need to be identified. Work is also needed to secure funding from organisations with an interest in improving drowning prevention outcomes in the Bay of Plenty for these interventions. Funding is also needed for the salary and operational costs of the Strategy Manager for the year beginning 1 July 2019.

Funding the strategy

12. WSNZ is a funder of the water safety sector. It provides funding to a wide range of organisations to undertake drowning prevention activities primarily through an annual competitive funding round. It also provides resources to sector organisations to provide water survival skills training and undertake research projects. It also allocates funding for initiatives that is specifically raised from the corporate and the philanthropic sector.
13. The immediate priorities of the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy have been identified by the Strategy's leadership group and WSNZ has built these into its funding prospectus for 2019/20. WSNZ is now accepting applications for funding in 2019/20 for initiatives that lead to:
 - Greater coverage for WSFL across the Bay of Plenty, including:
 - More children being taught WSFL;
 - More trained WSFL deliverers in schools;
 - Collaborations between private providers, schools and swim schools, particularly in rural and remote areas;
 - An increase in uptake of Coastguard membership and training, particularly the Day Skippers course in the Bay of Plenty;
 - Establishing a regular forum for those involved in aquatic recreational activities to strengthen the collective ability of the Bay of Plenty community to address water safety issues.
14. WSNZ does not, however, have the financial capacity to fund the salary and associated operational costs of the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy's Strategy Manager.

Contribution sought from Kawerau District Council

Funding for the Strategy manager

15. WSNZ would like KDC to consider contributing to funding the salary and operational costs of the Strategy Manager for the Bay of Plenty Water Safety Strategy. This is a critical role for the success of the Strategy and currently there is no funding available for Sport Bay of Plenty to meet the \$100,000 pa required for this role. WSNZ and Sport Bay of Plenty are currently fundraising so that this role can commence on 1 July 2019, but we have yet to secure a firm commitment for funding.

Co-production and support

16. We would like the KDC to consider how its operations can be focused on helping the water safety sector reduce preventable drowning in the Eastern Bay of Plenty. WSNZ is willing to work in partnership with the Council to implement initiatives to reduce preventable drowning deaths and injuries. The areas we see the most scope for collaborative activity with KDC is in the development of signage and in developing better collaborative relationships with Māori.

Relationships


17. We would like all KDC Councillors and key Council staff to be made aware of the coalition of interested parties already present within the Eastern Bay of Plenty community and wider water safety sector around drowning prevention. There is opportunity for Kawerau District Council to engage with these interested community groups, including Water Safety Bay of Plenty which led the development of the Strategy. There are also regional stakeholders that also have an interest in drowning prevention in the Bay of Plenty.
18. WSNZ also looks forward to engaging with KDC on the implementation of the Bay of Plenty Regional Water Safety Strategy that reduces the number of preventable drownings that occur within the KDC's boundary.

Promotion

19. WSNZ would like the KDC to include the Bay of Plenty Regional Water Safety Strategy in its community communications. We would also like the objectives and initiatives of the Strategy to be actively promoted by Kawerau District Council to the community in the Eastern Bay of Plenty.

Next steps

20. Water Safety New Zealand will continue to support promotion and implementation of the Bay of Plenty Regional Water Safety Strategy and will continue to seek partners for the funding and co-production of drowning prevention initiatives.
21. WSNZ would welcome the opportunity to speak to Kawerau District Council in support of this submission.

The Disabilities Resource Centre (DRC) would like to thank the Kawerau District Council (KDC) for the opportunity of commenting on the 2019/20 Annual Plan Consultation Document.

The Disabilities Resource Centre continues to appreciate and support the work the Council does to ensure a pleasant and economically growing district for residents. We acknowledge the Council's awareness of the access needs and rights of people with disabilities and its contribution to the lives of disabled people. DRC would also like to reiterate, the outstanding work KDC has accomplished in developing strong working relationships with senior interest groups in the area, invoking the notion of Kawerau being a retiree-friendly town.

DRC ask the Council to focus on three specific areas,

1. Recognise and protect the rights of disabled people by mandating consideration of disability issues in decision making, policy planning, strategic development and project works.
2. Recognise and protect the rights of older people by mandating consideration for age issues in decision making, policy planning, strategic development and project works.
3. Address physical and attitudinal barriers to participation through robust and inclusive strategic and policy planning.

Given that the Council is not proposing any new or major developments in the coming financial year beyond what was indicated in the Long Term Plan, it must be congratulated in inviting the community to consult about the level of activities Council is proposing to deliver and how they will be funded.

Residential Development

The Council's 2018-2028 Long Term Plan contained proposals for Residential Development. The Disabilities Resource Centre wish to congratulate the Council for it's Residential Developments at Te Ariki Place and Bowen Streets which are expected to be marketed from April and that construction of the River Road retirement units will commence in June.

CHANGES TO FEES AND CHARGES

Swimming Pool Complex

The Disabilities Resource Centre have clients whom frequently use the Swimming Pool Complex all year round as part of their individualised programmes as either rehabilitation to maximize their return to normal health and wellbeing, or to maintain their daily independent routines in keeping their optimal health and wellbeing.

DRC applauds the Council in its decision not to introduce admission charges.

Building Consents

DRC have clients who through health or aged related circumstances require support with personal cares, namely bathing or showering. For many showering requires, arduous and

often painful maneuvering over high lipped bathtubs to access overhead showers as is prevalent in many of the homes.

The new fees and charges of \$355.00 for consent to building a wet area shower, become an additional barrier for the elderly and disabled when also factoring in the actual costings of all materials, plumbing and labour.

DRC would support any initiatives the council may propose in which the aged, chronically ill and disabled community are able to fulfil a basic need, as being able to have safe access to shower facilities without pain, within their own homes.

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The district council's role is to install & maintain infrastructure & services.

As a small & growing business in Manukorihi Drive the proposed rates increase will see our rates rise to almost \$48,000 per annum (this is an increase of approximately \$2,000 PA, year on year, for the last ten years). For this fee, the council provides roading, power, water & waste disposal.

Our business is growing and will continue to provide jobs to local people. In return we ask very little of the council.

We are currently planning to invest in a large gas-fired furnace, however we require the natural gas supply pipeline (currently in Paora Ave) to be extended into Manukorihi drive. We see this as an essential part of Kawerau infrastructure, which will be of benefit to all businesses in the area.

We have contacted the council, however to date the council has offered very little assistance to get the gas pipeline installed in Manukorihi Drive.

My questions to the council are:

1. How does the council justify \$48K rating for our property, based on the services we currently receive?
2. Why can't the council assist local business by installing & upgrading infrastructure, ie. Natural gas distribution pipeline in Manukorihi Drive?

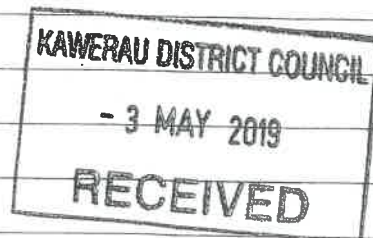
