We hope you are able to find moments of rest, connections and comfort this season and please remember the library is always here for you as a calm safe space to visit.






What's the picture?







Museum News 3

Pattern Making at Hasman Mill

This large wooden model of a ring gear was produced at the Tasman Pulp and Paper mill in the mid-1960s. It was made by the pattern makers who worked in the mill's pattern shop. They were responsible for crafting beautiful wooden moulds ('patterns') that were used to fabricate parts for the various machines that kept the mill operating.

Requiring incredibly accurate measurements so they would fit properly, the wooden patterns were turned into metal parts through the process of sand casting. Damp sand was pressed around the mould, which was then removed, leaving a hollow space that was filled with molten metal.

There were nearly 400 different shapes, each made from carefully shaped pieces of Tasman pine or kauri that were screwed or glued together to produce the finished pattern. They were then sent away to be cast at foundries in Hamilton, Thames, Wellington, Palmerston North and New Plymouth.
