TRANSFER STATION CHANGES FOR WHITEWARE

A new process for accepting whiteware has been put in place for the Kawerau Transfer Station. The reason for the new process, is that certain items of whiteware (like fridges and freezers) have fluorinated gases that need to be safely and removed by certified tradespeople.

Council has now put an agreement in place with a local business that will complete this process for whiteware at the Transfer Station. However, this means there will be a charge of \$47 per item which pays for the de-gassing to be completed.

On arrival, please check in with our Transfer Station staff to ensure that your whiteware does not contain the F-gases, which are harmful to the environment, and cannot be disposed of in the residual waste (the pit) or in the metal recycling collection bin (without first having the F-gases removed).

At the extraordinary meeting on 18 June, 2025 Council received 107 submissions. 103 submitters or 92% want Council to deliver drinking, stormwater and wastewater services to the district. Thank you to all our submitters, and a special thank you to Patrick Condon and Jane Richards for presenting to the Mayor and Elected Members. Council greatly appreciates the speakers conveying their submission points, Council confirmed the preference of continuing to deliver water services via an in-house business unit. Additionally, Council will continue to explore collaboration opportunities with its partners in Rotorua Lakes, Whakatāne and Ōpōtiki District Councils.

Notice of Representation Arrangements Review

Basis of Election

On 20 September 2024, Kawerau District Council gave public notice of its final proposal for representation arrangements to apply for the Council for the elections to be held on 11 October 2025.

Notification of the right to appeal was also given. No valid appeals were received in respect of the resolution, therefore the representation arrangements for Kawerau District Council's 2025 local elections will be the same as in the final proposal:

Council representation

The Kawerau District Council to comprise the mayor elected at large and eight councillors, these being:

- (i) **Kawerau Māori Ward**, represented by three Māori ward councillors, with the ward boundaries aligning with the district's boundaries.
- (ii) **Kawerau General Ward**, represented by three general ward councillors, with the ward boundaries aligning with the district's boundaries.
- (iii) In addition, Kawerau District Council will elect two councillors at large.
- b) The number of Māori ward councillors complies with Schedule 1A of the Local Electoral Act 2001.
- c) There being no community boards.

How to change your roll

If you're of Māori descent and enrolling for the first time, you have an important choice to make. You need to decide which electoral roll you want to be on, the general roll or the Māori roll.

Your roll choice affects which candidates you can choose from in parliamentary elections and local elections. It also helps determine the number of Māori and general electorates in future elections.

To change your roll visit www.vote.nz/enrolling/enrol-or-update/enrol-or-update-online/

If you are already enrolled, select I want to check or update, put in your details and then select 'I want to review and update' and verify your identity. Once verified, you can change any of your enrolment details, including your personal information and your roll.

Once you are happy, click declare and then click finish!

You have now updated your roll or information.
