CHANGES IN THIS ELECTION

Local Elections are coming up this year and there are some changes about who you can vote for!

If you're of Māori descent, you can choose to enrol on the Māori roll or the general roll. The roll you choose will affect who you can vote for at this year's local elections. If you are enrolled and would like to change the roll you are on before the local elections, you need to do it by Thursday 10 July 2025.

If you are on the Māori roll you can vote for the Mayor, two district wide councillors and three Māori ward councillors.

If you are on the General roll you can vote for the Mayor, two district wide councillors and three general ward councillors.

Last year, Council decided to retain Māori wards in place for the 2025 local elections. There will be a poll at the 2025 local elections to ask voters if they would like to retain or remove Māori wards.

TRANSFER STATION CHANGES FOR WHITEWARE



A new process for accepting whiteware has been put in place for the Kawerau Transfer Station. The reason for the new process, is that certain items of whiteware (like fridges and freezers) have fluorinated gases that need to be safely and removed by certified tradespeople.

Council has now put an agreement in place with a local business that will complete this process for whiteware at the Transfer Station.

However, this means there will be a charge of \$47 per item which pays for the de-gassing to be completed.

On arrival, please check in with our Transfer Station staff to ensure that your whiteware does not contain the F-gases, which are harmful to the environment, and cannot be disposed of in the residual waste (the pit) or in the metal recycling collection bin (without first having the F-gases removed).

New World Drinking Tap Update

Since Wednesday, 30 April Council has reinstated the chlorine free drinking water taps at the Kawerau New World carpark for use by the public.

Please note, the water from the taps at the Kawerau New World carpark contains fluoride, as per the direction of the Ministry of Health.

The River Road drinking water taps beside the pumphouse continue to be available for the community, offering chlorine and fluoride-free water.

Water from the River Road drinking water taps has undergone ultra-violet (UV) treatment only to deal with any protozoa, viruses and bacteria that might be present as the water comes out of the springs.

Eastern Bay Spatial Plan

Submissions open

During the past decade the Eastern Bay region has experienced a steady rise in population due to lifestyle appeal, improved transport connections, and more people choosing to live and work in smaller, more affordable centres.

Between 2013 and 2023, Kawerau's district population grew by 22%, and in the next 30 years, we estimate we'll need around 650 additional homes.

Our Places – Eastern Bay Spatial Plan is a long-term planning framework that looks at how and where growth should occur across the Eastern Bay region and Kawerau is a relatively small district geographically, it is home to major manufacturing operations, key transport links, and a growing population. But, with limited land, we need to plan carefully, making the most of what we have, and make sure growth happens in a way that benefits current and future generations. Please take note of the following timeframes

28 May 2025 Dog registration renewal notices issued

30 June 2025 Dog registration fees are due

1 July 2025 Reminder notices issued that registration

is overdue

1 August 2025

Last day for Dog Registration payment to avoid penalties

2 August 2025

Last reminder issued advising 50% penalty added to registration fee.

1 September 2025

Infringements will be issued for all unpaid dog registrations. Dog registration fees are still required to be paid, along with the infringement fee.

1 October 2025

Reminder Noticed for unpaid infringements issued

November 2025

Infringements must be paid by November to avoid being sent to court for collection of the infringement fee.

Dog registration fees are still required to be paid.
