# KEEP KAWERAU BEAUTIFUL BIG CLEAN UP

Keep Kawerau Beautiful held its annual Big Clean Up on Sunday, 21 September with fantastic support from local businesses and organisations including Essity, Rotary Club of Kawerau, Gravity Sport, New World Kawerau, Bunnings Whakatāne, Jones and Cole, The Echo and Tidy Taupō.

Some 60 volunteers came together to make a difference. The volunteers worked hard clearing rubbish and overgrown weeds, like privet, from the forest track at Waterhouse Street steps.

Over the course of the day, an impressive 800kgs of rubbish was collected and responsibly disposed of at the Kawerau Transfer Station.

A huge thank you to everyone who volunteered their time and energy to help keep Kawerau beautiful.

Council also extends its appreciation to the district cleaners and the parks and reserves team for their valuable contribution on the day, helping to clear rubbish and support the clean-up efforts across the district.

# **Drinking Water Pipe Renewal Plan**

There are approximately 77km of drinking water pipes supplying properties throughout Kawerau.

Since 2010, around 60% of the total drinking water pipe network has already been replaced. The project will cost \$12 million, funded by loans, and is scheduled to be completed in the 2029 financial year.

This year, Council is renewing Areas 5 and 6 of the Drinking Water Pipe Replacement Plan. So far, 2km of pipe has been replaced throughout Waterhouse Street, Porritt Drive, Payne Crescent and Ward Street. An additional 4.5km is scheduled for completion in Area 5, along with 4.2km in Area 6, which includes Tamarangi Drive, Paora Street, and Spencer Avenue. Council recently approved a \$2 million loan from the Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA) to fund drinking water pipe replacements in Areas 4 and 7. Work in these areas is set to begin in October 2026, with completion expected in the 2026-2027 financial year.

#### **Water Service Delivery Plan**

An internal business unit is the preferred delivery option of three waters services to community, as adopted and submitted in our Water Service Delivery Plan on 3 September 2025 to the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA).

The Water Service Delivery Plan outlines how Kawerau District Council will continue to deliver drinking, waste and storm water services under the Local Water Done Well framework. It confirms Council's commitment to retaining ownership and control of water services by keeping them inhouse, ensuring compliance with regulatory, environmental and financial standards.

Mayor Faylene Tunui said, "Kawerau has done water well, with 60% of the drinking reticulation already renewed since 2021. The remainder of the drinking water pipes will be replaced in the next four years.

"Kawerau will also replace the majority of the wastewater pipe network in the coming 10 years, funded from depreciation reserves."

Earlier in 2025, during April to May, Kawerau District Council received considerable feedback from the community and community partners supporting the plan for keeping an internal business unit. The formal submission process gathered 107 submissions, of which 92% supported the internal business unit.

As of writing, Council has received no feedback on the plan from the DIA.



# Paralympic Athlete John Morgan swims across New Zealand

Thirteen-time gold medalist at two Paralymic games, John Morgan came to the Maurie Kjar Aquatic Centre, last month, fresh from competing in the World Masters' Swimming Championship in Singapore, Born in California, John found early success as a competitive swimmer and continued with the sport even after an accident at 15 left him without sight. John still today holds world records, and in 2008 was inducted into the American Olympic Hall of Fame.

John and his wife were in town to visit an old friend, as one of the final stops on their first-ever trip to New Zealand. After visiting Christchurch, Dunedin, Queenstown, Wellington, and Tauranga, they arrived in Kawerau for a few days before heading to Rotorua, Auckland, and then on to Fiji.

A highlight of their journey was swimming in the local pools in every town they visited. John gave the Maurie Kjar Aquatic Centre high praise, saying it is beautifully open and welcoming. Later this year, John Morgan will be competing again in the Scandinavian Swimming Championship.

# OCTOBER 16, 2025 IS THE NATIONAL EARTHQUAKE DRILL TAKING PLACE AT 9:30AM.

The aim of the drill is to ensure that we all remember to protect ourselves and loved ones if a large earthquake does occur.

#### **HOW DO I TAKE PART?**

New Zealand ShakeOut is a self-run earthquake drill.

DROP

down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.

COVER

your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you). If there is no shelter nearby, cover your head and neck with your arms and hands.

HOLD

on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

While you are doing the drill, take note of what might be happening around you.

Think about what you might need to do to prepare for a real earthquake.

Remember, as we don't have any risk of a tsunami, in Kawerau we don't need to evacuate.

The best and safest place is to stay at home, stay off the roads... be aware of where the safest place is in your whare/home or property.

#### OTHER THINGS TO THINK ABOUT AND PLAN FOR:

What may need securing at your home (hot water cylinder, bookshelves, for example)

What supplies do you have at home of wai and kai (water and food)?

How will you contact loved ones?

Do you have a plan for meeting up with loved ones?
What is the plan of the kura/school where your children go?
