Infringements will be issued for all unpaid dog registrations. Dog registration fees are still required to be paid, along with the infringement fee.

Reminder Notice for unpaid infringements issued

November 2025

Infringements must be paid by November to avoid being sent to court for collection of the infringement fee. Dog registration fees are still required to be paid.

Updates to street signs

We have replaced 42 Give Way signs, around Kawerau!

Waka Kotahi | NZTA has updated the Traffic Control Devices Rule and Manual, affecting how Stop and Give Way signs are designed and installed across New Zealand.

Key Changes:

- New and revised standards for Stop and Give Way signs to improve clarity and consistency.
- Sign sizes have been aligned nationally to reduce material waste and streamline production.
- The Traffic Control Devices Manual (TCD Manual) now fully replaces the older MOTSAM system, offering clearer guidance and legal requirements.
- To enhance road safety and simplify compliance for councils and contractors.

These updates are part of the Regulatory Systems Rule Amendment (RSRA) 2025, which is designed to modernise and future-proof New Zealand's road signage system.

Council paid for 25% and we were able to use the NZTA Waka Kotahi 75% subsidy to fund the remainder of the project completed in June 2025.

Solid waste hearing

The solid waste hearing took place on Wednesday, August 27.

Thank you to the 79 people who submitted on the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan 2025 – 2031, and a special thank you to Patrick Condon for presenting to the Mayor and Elected Members.

There was excellent feedback, information and data provided by the submitters, which will be considered following the hearing.

占 Mobility parking

Last year, the government significantly increased fines for individuals who misuse mobility parking spaces. In October 2024, the penalty for parking in a space reserved for people with mobility difficulties without displaying a permit increased from \$150 to \$750.

Recently, Council has noticed an increase in people parking in these mobility spaces without a permit. Warnings have been issued, but infringements will start being enforced.

Please be considerate of people when parking and park in the non-mobility spots available, if you do not have the appropriate permit.
