of the community with the Alert Level 2 guidelines in place to keep our community safer.

In line with this, we know our vaccination rates need to keep lifting to ensure we are protecting our community.

In total, we have some 6,300 people aged 12 years and over eligible for the vaccination.

This means that more than 4,477 people have received their first vaccination and 3,559 people are now fully vaccinated. This takes us up to 58.5% fully vaccinated.

We had another successful Super Saturday #4 last weekend with more than 160 people vaccinated.

To encourage people with concerns to talk and engage we recently facilitated a community meeting with a number of key stakeholders. The result is that we will see a number of community-based events run out in the district.

This will be in addition to the ongoing clinics at the Kawerau Town Hall. Please encourage your whanau to have open discussions with health professionals should they have concerns or queries about the vaccine.

With regards to Three Waters Reform, the Local Government Minister Nanaia Mahuta recently announced that the Government would legislate in early December to create four new water entities that would take on the water assets currently owned by councils.

However, our Council, along with a number of others, are co-signing a letter requesting to meet urgently with the Prime Minister about the Three Waters Reform. We have heard your feedback and will progress all avenues to protect and enhance our community's water assets.

Many projects and ongoing maintenance work continues in the district including the rebuilding of the Rangi Delamere Netball Pavilion which was damaged by arson. We are working with the builder to rebuild this and have set aside the insurance payment to do this work which is planned to be completed by mid-2022.

Finally, on behalf of my Council, we wish to acknowledge the passing of former longserving Kawerau District Councillor Kath Paul who served our district from 1992 until 2001. It was an honour to know her and serve with her on Council. She will be greatly missed by all. Our condolences to the family at this sad time.

THREE WATERS REFORM UPDATE



Kawerau District Council is disappointed for its community that the government is taking away the choice to join or opt out of the Three Waters Reform.

Council thanks and acknowledges the community for near record levels of feedback sent in on the reform. After consultation with independent experts, staff and even DIA's (Department of Internal Affairs) own consultants it was concluded that Kawerau would be better off to keep the status quo and not proceed with the reform. Council will continue to go ahead with its upgrades to its Three Waters infrastructure to ensure that Kawerau does not fall behind compared to larger districts and keep ahead of the curve.

RANGI DELAMERE NETBALL PAVILION

The community will have seen a major change recently with the Rangi Delamere Netball Pavilion being completed dismantled.

Sadly, the pavilion was the scene of arson earlier in 2020 which caused major damage.

Council originally planned to utilise the remaining concrete walls in the new building which had been incorporated into the new design.

However, recent advice from engineers showed that the remaining concrete walls would have required significant earthquake strengthening work.

After this advice, Council resolved at the end of October that it was more sensible and financially prudent to rebuild.

The design of the new pavilion includes allowing users access from both the court-side and Prideaux Park.

Unfortunately, due to the building boom and supply issues caused by COVID-19, Council received limited expressions of interest from builders during the tender process. A builder has now been secured and the insurance monies of \$500,000 are in the bank waiting to be paid as soon as the builder can start the work.

Council knows this has been a long process and will keep the community informed of the timeline to rebuild this important community asset.

- Free dog or puppy de-sexing vouchers: Note there is a limited number of free vouchers, but other assistance may be available
- All dogs and pups must remain on a lead.
- No entry to sick or dogs on heat.
- Owners are responsible for keeping control of and cleaning up after their pets.

Conditions apply:

- Clinic is available to Kawerau residents only.
- You must bring proof of address and a Community Services Card or Gold Card.
- To qualify for a free de-sexing voucher, dogs must be present at the clinic and have no pre-existing health issues or skin diseases.

What this means is out of the Kawerau population of 6,310 there are 3,559 residents fully vaccinated, 4,477 who have had their first dose and 1,833 unvaccinated.
